PERRANUTHNOE CLASS UPDATE

This week we have been exploring our Kings and Queens topic, in History, we were completely inspired by our artefact box about kings, queens and castles. The children were so excited by the knight's chainmail and discussions occurred about archery, castle features and trebuchets! We watched a video of a real trebuchet launch and then went off to research castles. The children made diagrams and models, naming the different parts of the castle.

In Science we went out in the forest. We learnt all about food chains, producers and consumers and even drew our own.

In Maths we have been adding and subtracting two-digit numbers, locating tens and ones in number sentences. We have also measured ourselves in metres and centimetres, who is the tallest, who is the smallest? We have looked at heavier and lighter and full and empty, having fun learning in the water play. In English, we went on a Curious Quest to find words ending in -ed. We listened to the story of The Queen's hat and helped Professor Klunk and his story machine to look for apostrophes!

We have also been practising for our Christmas performance, 'All around the world' I'm sure you have heard some of the songs at home!

Have a device-free day


Turn down the heating by 1 degree for a week
