For any year 6 pupils interested in 'Nexus', they will be holding two masterclasses for year 6 students to attend:

Wednesday 16th October 3.45pm-5.30pm:

Nexus Liberal Arts Masterclass

This event will involve meeting current Nexus students, hearing about the Nexus Programme and then our expert staff will deliver 3 x 30 minute sessions in Modern Foreign Languages, History and English.

Thursday 24th October 3.45-5.30pm:

Nexus STEM Masterclass

This event will also involve meeting current Nexus students, hearing about the Nexus Gifted programme and then our expert staff will deliver 3 x 30 minute sessions in Computing, Maths and Science.

About Nexus

Nexus is unique in Cornwall, providing state-funded specialist education to able and gifted young people. There is a strong focus on academic achievement, alongside a bespoke curriculum aimed to engage and challenge our students. Students join the programme in Year 7 following a rigorous assessment and interview process. Nexus is part of Camborne Science and International Academy and is situated on a separate campus next to Camborne train station as well as being only 5 minutes from the main bus station. As a consequence, Nexus attracts students from all over Cornwall from St Just to Padstow.

School Closures in Emergency – Agreed Notification Procedure

Please see the attached guidance from Cornwall Council. Sometimes schools have to make the decision to close either partially or fully due to inclement weather such as snow or other unforeseen circumstances. The procedures are revised annually. The agreed notification Procedure for our school is: We will inform Cornwall Council so they can update their website We will inform local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM, Pirate FM) so they can make announcements and update their websites We will post on our Facebook pages, "The Federation of Boskenwyn and Germoe School," "Boskenwyn FOBS" and "Germoe FROGS" If you wake up to a blanket of snow in the near future then please make sure you check one or more of the above places to keep up to date with school closures, it may be that we open later or close earlier so you will need to check before coming to school. If the school needs to close whilst the children are there then we will contact all parents via phone

GODREVY CLASS UPDATE

This has been a VERY busy week in Godrevy Class!

The Year Sixes went to Humphry Davy and Mounts Bay to test out what it is like in secondary school. In their science lesson they made "farts, boogers and wee", they added dry ice to the food coloured water and sodium hydrocarbonate- which made the "wee" change colour- this was Joey and Oskars' favourite part! When they finished their lunchtime they went to the football pitch and played penalty shoot-outs. Yesterday, was National Poetry Day. Year Fives read a poem called Paean (or Eleven Uses for a Garden Pea) which was very exciting, we illustrated the poem and we were inspired to write our own. Bohdi's was about the eleven uses for a pasty, while Ciara's was about the uses for an apple. Today we all took part in a music workshop in Penzance. We were able to compose our own music with children from other schools and there were fascinating instruments all around. Our main theme for the morning was "water" and this was what we created our music about.



PRICE INCREASES FROM SEPTEMBER

Unfortunately, due to the cost of living rise and the restraint this has on our budget, we will have to make the following price increases from September: School meals will be £3 per day. Breakfast club will be £4 per child/£3 per child, if eligible for FSM (including food). After school care will be £4 per child/£3 per child, if eligible for FSM, for the first hour (including snack). A late charge of £4 per 15 mins (for each child) will be incurred due to staff staying later than contracted. Kindergarten snack will be £2 per week payable via School money We apologise for this but there is no other way to make our income and expenditure align.

Tax-Free Childcare

Tax-Free Childcare is:

- For working families, including the self-employed, in the UK
- Earning under £100k and an average of £167 per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage) each over three months
- Who aren't receiving Tax Credits, Universal Credit or childcare vouchers
- With children aged 0-11 (or 0-16 if disabled)
- For every £8 you pay into an online account, the government will add an extra £2, up to £2,000 per child per year
